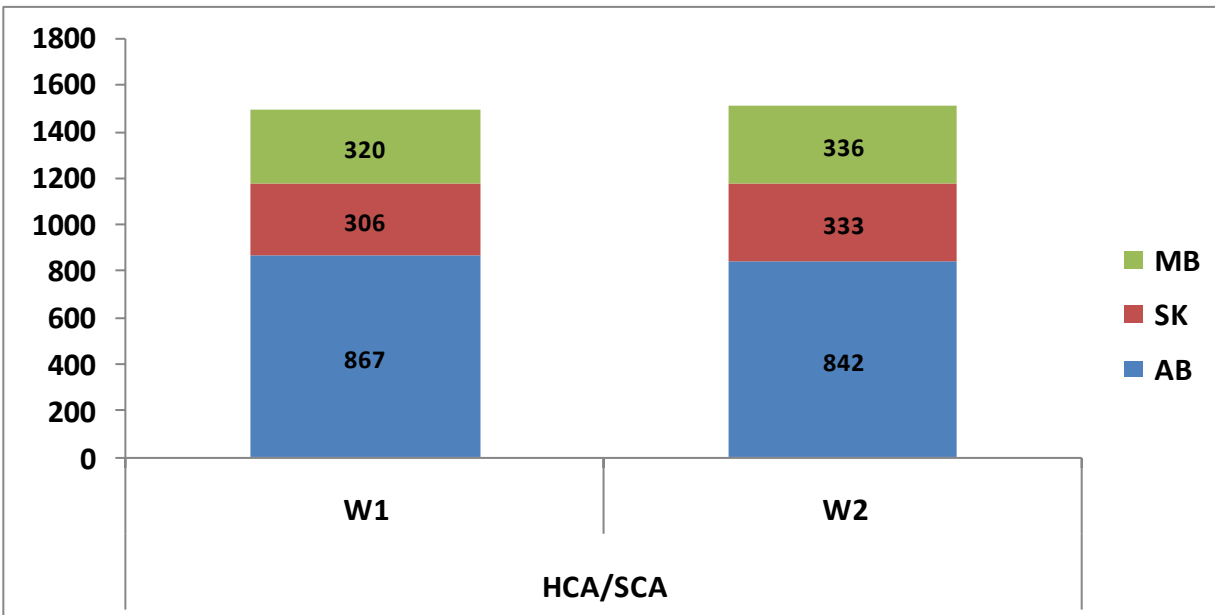

I wish you all a very pleasant summer!

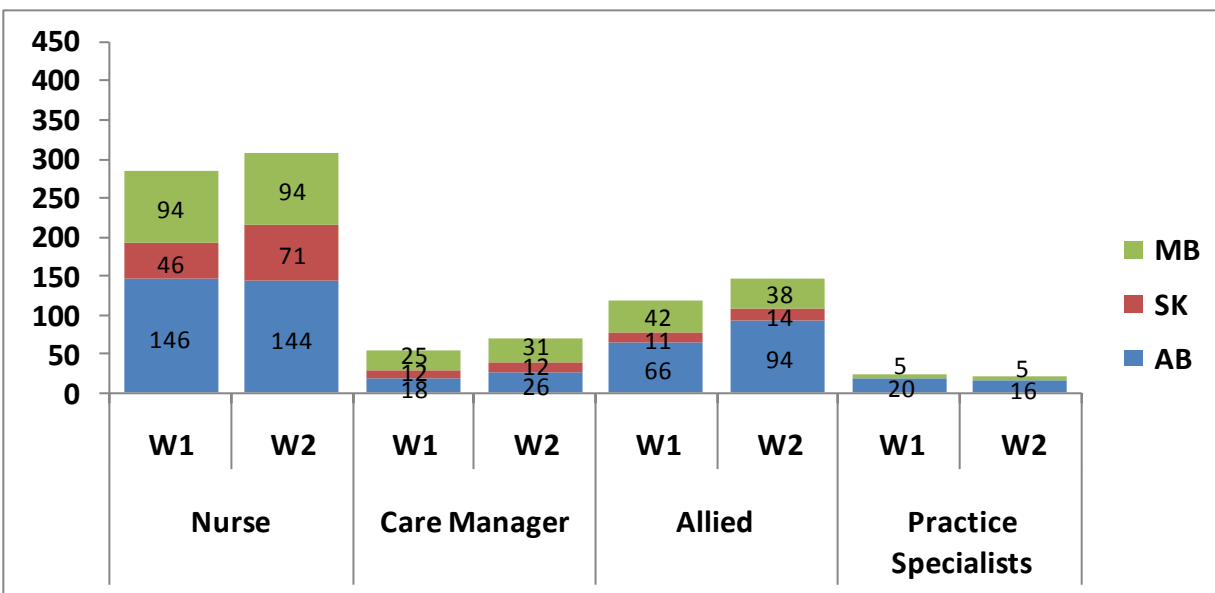

The above chart indicates that in Wave 1 of data collection 1493 healthcare aides/special care aides were interviewed face-to-face by our research assistants. In Wave 2 this number increased to 1511 aides being interviewed face-to-face.



In Wave 1, 485 regulated staff (nurses, care managers, allied professionals and practice specialists) completed the survey. In Wave 2, the respondents increased to 545.
